Apply for Taiwanese Visa

Please prepare for VISA Application Form from the link below:

1. Original and photocopy of passport (with blank visa pages and at least six months validity)
 2. Two ID photos (4cm*5cm) taken in the last six months (paste on application form)
 3. Visa Application form (Resident Visa)
All visa applicants need first to access the website:
(<https://visawebapp.boca.gov.tw>), fill out the visa application forms online and print them out.
 4. Original and photocopy of NTU Admission Letter (acceptance letter) (It will be sent from NTU administrative office in December or January.)
 5. Original and photocopy of Health Certificate (Health check report)
 6. Certificate of enrollment of UT (I will prepare for you)
 7. Original of Balance Certificate issued by your bank/post office
 7. Visa issue fee: 8900 yen
- 2 sides copy of Japanese residence card (Except Japanese Students)**

Before your arrival in NTU

You may need to apply for a valid Visa BEFORE entering Taiwan. There is no specific “Student Visa” for international students studying in Taiwan; recommended Visa choices are listed below. Contact the Taiwan (ROC) diplomatic mission in your country/region for the required documents, latest information and advisement.

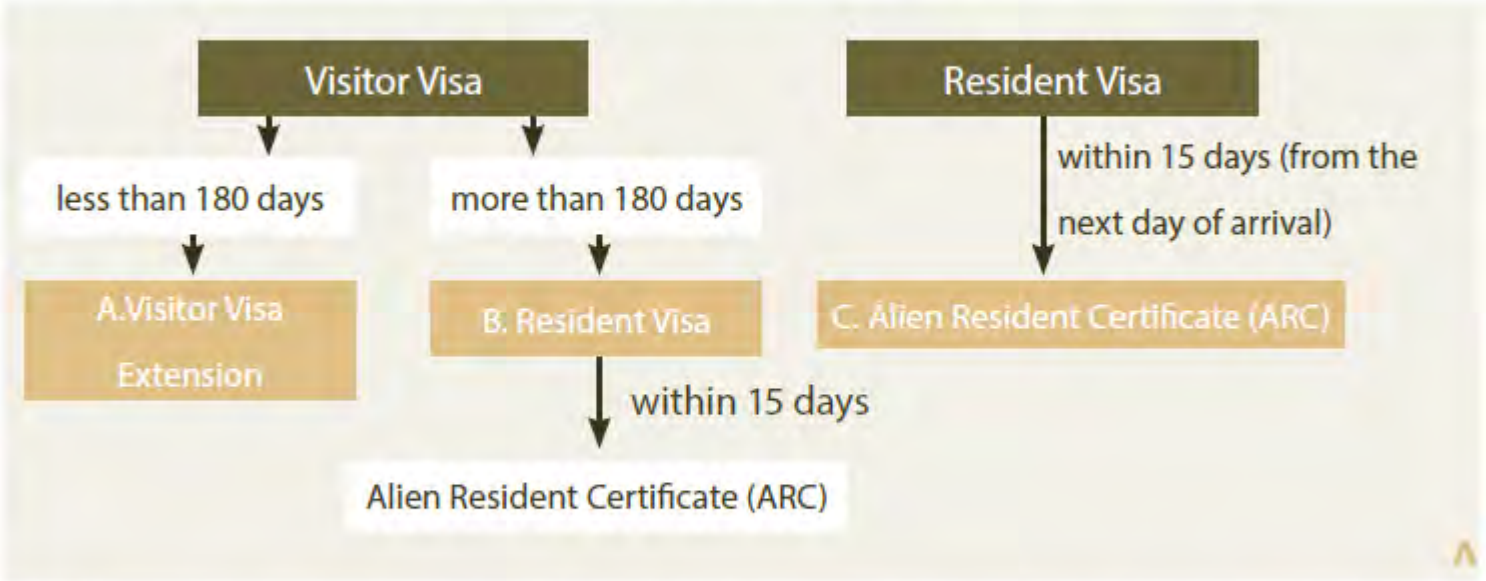
■ Visa Type and Overview

| Visa Type | Overview |
|--------------------------------|--|
| Visitor Visa [停留簽證] | <p>You should apply for a Visitor Visa if you are exchanging or visiting for a period of 1 semester or less.</p> <p>Requirements and restrictions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Visitor Visas are single-entry only and cannot be changed to multiple-entry after you arrive in Taiwan.• Visa extensions must be applied for within 15 days of the current Visa’s expiration date.• Visitor Visa holders may not enter Taiwan after the “Enter Before” date regardless of whether it is a multiple-entry Visa or an extended Visa. |
| Resident Visa [居留簽證] | <p>You should apply for a Resident Visa if you are exchanging or visiting for a period of 1 academic year.</p> <p>Requirements and restrictions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Within 15 days of arriving in Taiwan, Resident Visa holders shall apply for an Alien Resident Certificate (ARC) and a re-entry permit through National Immigration Agency .• A health certificate issued by a licensed foreign hospital or clinic within 3 months is required for the application of Resident Visa. |



After your arrival in NTU

After you arrive in Taiwan, you may need to take further steps to maintain your Visa status depending on the plan of your stay and the type of Visa you have. **It is your responsibility to maintain your status in Taiwan.**



All Visa/ARC requirements listed in this chapter are subject to change. You are encouraged to check on the relevant websites (e.g. Bureau of Consular Affairs or National Immigration Agency) for the latest information.



Registration in NTU

Registration

You will receive your student ID card upon completion of registration. Procedures include completing payment and submitting required documents.

OIA will hold a session for the registration of all international students. You will receive your student ID card after completing the registration procedures.

For students who don't have insurance, there will be insurance company at site.

Scholarships in NTU

NTU Scholarship

Outstanding
International
Graduate Student
Scholarship

Benefits: Tuition waiver + Monthly stipend of min. TWD 6,000 (USD 200)

Requirements: All international degree students can apply (We recommend that you contact your potential supervisor regarding scholarship possibilities)

Note: Tuition waiver is limited to TWD 130,000 per academic year.

Government Scholarships

MOFA Taiwan
Scholarship

Benefits: 1 economy-class return ticket for coming to Taiwan and returning to one's home country + a monthly of TWD 30,000 (USD 1000)

Note: this scholarship is only available to students from countries that have diplomatic relations with Taiwan, or have friendly relations with Taiwan according to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MOFA).

MOE Taiwan
Scholarship

Benefits: Tuition waiver of up to TWD 40,000 (USD 1,333) + monthly stipend of TWD 20,000 (USD 666)

Note: this scholarship offered by the Ministry of Education is available for students from countries ineligible for the MOFA Taiwan Scholarship.

MOST Taiwan
Scholarship

Benefits: monthly stipend of TWD 30,000 (USD 1000)

Note: this scholarship is only available to students from countries annually designated by the Ministry of Science and Technology.

Before your arrival in Bordeaux

What you will need to do in order to prepare your arrival in Bordeaux



↘ Complete the mobility application

The International office will ask you to complete the on-line application and send it by e-mail with a copy of your valid passport.

↘ Apply for the student visa

Once you will send the mobility application (with a copy of your passport), you will receive the Acceptance letter with the instruction regarding your student visa application. It is recommended to start the visa procedure 3 or 4 months before your arrival.

↘ Apply for the housing

The international office will inform you about the options of dormitory

The International office will also provide with the information regarding

↘ Buddy system

You can benefit from Buddy system in Bordeaux, it means to have a French mentor helping you at your arrival in Bordeaux

↘ Registration documents

You will need to bring some documents in order to be registered such as the proof of your registration at your Home university and the Health insurance covering the repatriation and the civil liability. The International office will give you the complete list.

↘ French course

The International office will inform you about the possibility to follow a free French course taking place twice a week (you can obtain 3 ECTS credits after completing the exam).

During and after your mobility



↘ **At your arrival, you will proceed to your registration at the university and then you will obtain your student card**

→ You come in the International office and complete all documents needed for your registration. In a few days you will receive your student card.

"Aqui PASS" student card

→ Students are given an Aquipass card when they register. This is a personal, electronic, multi-service card that they may use throughout their studies at the university.

↘ **Offered services**

As student of the University of Bordeaux, you will be able to benefit from all university services -> detailed information on the next slide

↘ **Transcript of records / Diploma**

At the end of your mobility in Bordeaux, you will obtain the Transcript of records and the Diploma of the Master degree. If you leave before, the International office can send you the original documents by mail.

Service offered at the University of Bordeaux



As students of the **University of Bordeaux** you will benefit from the following services

- **Student Life office** where you can obtain any practical information about your life on the campus. They also organize cultural and social events for students.
- **Library** where you can study and borrow study materials.
- **Sports** – you can choose a large scale of sport courses
- **Student Health Care center** during your stay in Bordeaux you can take an appointment for any health care advice you may need.
- **Nurse** – you can also ask an appointment with the nurse
- **Service for disable students** – special care is dedicated to the students with any disability
- **Student associations** – you can take part in one of many student associations
- **Culture** – numerous cultural events are organized during whole academic year
- **Department for languages** – you can learn French or another foreign language in Bordeaux
