Application Guidelines for September 2026 Enrollment (August Selection Process)

For applicants who wish to choose a faculty member of the University of Tsukuba as their supervisor

"Food and Health" is a

global issue,

extending beyond national borders. With the aim to develop highly specialized professionals who can both appreciate "Food and Health" and be active internationally, the University of Tsukuba established the International Joint Degree Master's Program in Agro-Biomedical Science in Food and Health in cooperation with the University of Bordeaux (France) and National Taiwan University (Taiwan). Students of this program attend lectures and receive research guidance for at least a semester on site at each university and will receive a "Master of Agro-Biomedical Science in Food and Health" degree upon graduation, jointly awarded by the three universities. If you wish to enroll in this program, please read the application guidelines below before applying.

Those who wish to choose a faculty member of the University of Bordeaux or National Taiwan University as their supervisor cannot apply through these guidelines.

1. Prospective Students

This program seeks students with a background in medical or agro-biological resources science and a cooperative spirit who are strongly determined to innovate and contribute to the future of society and Mankind by overcoming national and academic boundaries to assertively tackle global-scale issues related to the fields of health and food.

2. Number of Students to be Admitted

3 students

3. Eligibility for Application

Eligible applicants of the Graduate School must meet one of the following requirements, in accordance with the provisions of the School Education Act:

(A) No eligibility screening is required for the following individuals:

- Individuals who have graduated or who will graduate from a Japanese four-year university by August 2026.
- Individuals who have graduated from a university outside Japan that implements 16 or more years



of school curriculum, up to university graduation, and earned a bachelor's degree by August 2026.

- Others (for applicants who do not fall into the above 2 categories)
- (B) Eligibility screening is required for the following individuals:
 - Individuals who have reached 22 years of age or will reach 22 years of age by August 2025, who have been admitted to the graduate school of the University with academic ability equivalent or superior to that of a university graduate through an individual admission eligibility screening conducted by the graduate school of the University.
 - Others (for applicants who do not fall into the above category.)

Individuals expected to undergo eligibility screening must contact the Office of the International Joint Degree Master's Program in Agro-Biomedical Science in Food and Health (see below, **13. Contact Us**) in advance. The required screening documents **must** be submitted by **July 2 2025**.

4. Notices Before Applying

It is recommended, but not required, to contact your prospective supervisor in advance. A minimum score of 61 for TOEFL iBT, 600 for TOEIC Listening & Reading Test, 5.0 for IELTS or EIKEN Test Grade Pre-1 is required as this program conducts all lectures and research guidance in English. Scores from the TOEFL iBT Home Edition test can be accepted as certification of English proficiency.

5. Examination Fee

JPY 30,000 (except for Government-Sponsored [Japanese Government *Monbukagakusho* Scholarship] foreign students)

- 1. Payment Period: July 9, 2025 \sim July 22, 2025
- 2. Procedure: Payment must be made by a credit card or at a convenience store (for details, refer to the attachment.)

6. Documents to be Submitted

We will review applicant contents and bachelor's program results, purposes and plans of study in this program, career plans after graduation, and English proficiency. We will also evaluate the applicant's background and determination to solve global issues concerning "food and health" as well as aptitude for international and interdisciplinary study based on the documents below.

All documents from (1) to (12) must be prepared in English. If you are submitting in a language other than English under unavoidable circumstances, attach the English translation along with the original.

(1) Application Form (Official Form)

Attach the "Certificate of Payment" issued by a convenience store or a credit card to the designated column of the application form.

(2) Curriculum Vitae/Employment Record (Official Form)

Submission of the Employment Record is required only for applicants who have a work history.

- (3) Reference Card/Photo Card (Official Form) Paste an identical photograph on both cards.
- (4) Essay (Official Form)



Fill in your motivation and background for entrance to this program and your research plan during the program (including purpose and plan of study plus career plan) within 500 words in English. The font must be Times New Roman and the size 11 points. Any alteration in style and/or insertion of figures and graphs will cause the essay to be rejected.

(5) (Expected) Graduation Certificate/Academic Transcript

Submit a graduation certificate (or an official document certifying that you are expected to graduate) issued by a university or other type of educational institution that awarded or will award you a bachelor's degree.

If any subject mentioned in the transcript has been certified because of a transfer, please also submit the academic transcript from the previous school, etc., along with the latest transfer.

If your GPA is not mentioned in the transcript and you possess other GPA certification, please submit this documentation as well.

* Submit only original documents with an official seal. When submitting copies of certificates that cannot be reissued or for other reasons, a copy may be submitted only if the issuer of the certificate certifies that the copy is identical to the original (official seal of the issuer is required).

* If the certificate (original) is issued online by an overseas university office, a copy of the page and the URL of the official website of the issuing institution (university) must be attached to the certificate to confirm that the online certificate is equivalent to the original one.

* For graduates of Chinese universities, substitution of the original English version of the Academic Credentials Verification Report issued by the 'China Higher Education Information and Student Information Office (CHSI (Japan))' is acceptable. For those who have completed the 「自学考試

(本科) 」 and obtained a degree, the original transcript and degree certificate issued by the institution conducting the 「自学考試」 must be submitted. Applications from applicants who have not yet completed 「自学考試」 are not accepted.

(6) Degree Certificate

Applicants who graduated or expected to graduate from a foreign university must submit a document (degree certificate) to certify that they have a degree equivalent to a bachelor's degree.

Applicants who have obtained a qualification for application from the National Institution for Academic Degrees and University Evaluation must submit a certificate of the degree awarded (a certificate of acceptance of application for the degree), an academic transcript, and other certificates related to earning the degree.

* If the certificate (original) is issued online by an overseas university graduate office, a copy of the page and the URL of the official website of the issuing institution (university) must be attached to the certificate to confirm that the online certificate is equivalent to the original one.

(7) Letter of Recommendation

This should be obtained from your supervisor or homeroom teacher of your university (with affixed seal or signature.) If it is written in a language other than English, attach the English translation.

(8) Documents to Prove English Proficiency

You are required to submit an original copy of your TOEIC Listening & Reading Test Official Score Certificate/ Official Score Report, TOEIC Listening & Reading Test Digital Official Score Certificate, TOEFL Examinee (Test Taker) Score Report which is sent to the TOEFL examinee from ETS by postal mail (scores of the TOEFL iBT Home Edition test can be also accepted), IELTS Academic Module Test Report Form (IELTS Online results are not acceptable), or Certificate of Passing EIKEN Test Grade Pre-1 or higher. Certificates must be original or reissued originals as photocopies are unacceptable. However, print outs of TOEIC Digital Official Score Certificates are acceptable. Although there is no specific time limit for past examinations, it is preferable for the examination to have been taken within the past five years.



Applicants eligible for an exemption from submitting TOEIC, TOEFL, IELTS academic score requirements or Certificate of Passing EIKEN Test include the following:

1) Those whose first or native language is English.

- 2) Those from a country where English is an official language.
- 3) Those who completed undergraduate courses fully conducted in English.

If you fall under one of the above categories and wish to request this exemption, submit a letter that briefly summarizes your own linguistic background to support your request.

(9) Letter of Approval for Entrance Examination

Applicants who currently attend a university or graduate school (except those who are expected to graduate by August 2026) must submit a letter of approval for taking the entrance examination issued by the head of their university, or submit a written self-declaration stating that the applicant will withdraw from their current university before enrollment. (free format, A4 size)

Applicants who currently work for a government agency, school, or company (except for part-time workers) must submit a letter of approval for taking the entrance examination issued by the head of the institute (or department). Applicants who plan to leave their company to enroll in the graduate school may submit a written self-declaration stating that the applicant will withdraw from the company before enrollment as a substitute for the letter of approval.

(10) Certificate of Government-Sponsored (Japanese Government *Monbukagakusho* Scholarship) Foreign Student

If you are enrolled in another university at the time of application, submit a Certificate of Government-Sponsored (Japanese Government *Monbukagakusho* Scholarship) Foreign Student issued by the university.

(11) Self-Declaration on Specific Categories for Security Export Control (Official Form) All applicants should submit this form.

(12) Application Form for Online Entrance Examination (Official Form)

Submit this form if you reside abroad at the time of application.

- *In principle, documents submitted in support of your application will not be returned to you.
- *If your current name is different from that on submitted certificates (for example, because of marriage), submit a copy of the relevant section of your family register/official records. If you wish to use your maiden name for student registration after enrollment, you may proceed with necessary procedures during admission.
- * Erroneous or suspect scores on any submitted score sheet will be confirmed with the issuer.
- * If any false or forged statements are found in the application documents, or if there is any obvious examination misconduct, acceptance and admission may be revoked.

7. Application Procedure

Submit originals of all required certificates and supporting documents by simplified registered mail or at the GIP-TRIAD Office before the application deadline.

Application submission period: July 9, 2025 to July 22, 2025

Registered mail must arrive at the GIP-TRIAD Office by July 22. If submitting the application documents at the GIP-TRIAD Office, bring them by 17:00 (Japan Standard Time) on July 22. Where to submit: GIP-TRIAD Office (International Joint Degree Master's Program in Agro-Biomedical Science in Food and Health) (see below, **13. Contact Us**).

8. Screening Criteria

Screening of documents will proceed based on the documents mentioned in "6. Documents to be Submitted."



The oral examination in English will be conducted on August 25, 2025.

*The oral examination will be conducted online for applicants who reside abroad. Such applicants must submit the Application Form for Online Entrance Examination within the application period.

Screening Method and Criteria

For the presentation, prepare your slides in PowerPoint (slides must have a white background). The slides must be converted into a PDF file and both PowerPoint and PDF files must be sent to <u>gip_info@un.tsukuba.ac.jp</u> before 17:00 (Japan Standard Time) on August 18, 2025. On the examination day, bring your USB memory stick in which your presentation documents are saved.

9. Testing Location

University of Tsukuba (1-1-1 Tennodai, Tsukuba, Ibaraki 305-8575, Japan) For details of the date and meeting place, refer to the "Information and Instructions for Examinees" that will be sent after the application deadline.

10. Applicants in Need of Assistance

11. Announcement of Acceptance

September 11, 2025 Successful applicants will be notified about further procedures via email. Please understand that we cannot respond to any inquiries regarding examination results.

12. Enrollment Procedure

Follow the directions in the Enrollment Procedure Guidelines which will be sent out to successful applicants.

Expenses Required Upon Entrance

(1) Entrance fees: JPY 282,000

(2) Yearly tuition: JPY 535,800

Academic year 2026 (September 2026 – March 2027): JPY 312,550

- * Government-sponsored (Japanese Government *Monbukagakusho* Scholarship) foreign students are exempted from paying the entrance fees.
- * The students of this program will rotate through the University of Tsukuba, University of Bordeaux,



and National Taiwan University to spend a semester studying at each university. Students who have entered the University of Tsukuba through this examination will not be required to pay tuition or entrance fees to the University of Bordeaux or National Taiwan University.

Expenses that need to be paid after enrollment include costs related to visa applications, travel expenses to France and Taiwan, living expenses, and insurance fees.

- * According to the University of Tsukuba's guidelines, students are prohibited from traveling abroad when the Ministry of Foreign Affairs issues Level 2 or higher safety information (including danger and infectious disease risk) for an affected country/region. (Level 2: Avoid non-essential travel) In such circumstances, students in Japan might need to attend online or on-demand classes offered by the University of Bordeaux or National Taiwan University.
- * Other Notes

Individuals with nationalities other than Japanese must follow the Immigration Control and Refugee Recognition Act and be qualified for a resident status to enter graduate school before proceeding to the enrollment procedures. Individuals who wish to enroll in the university as a foreign exchange student must qualify for a "Student" resident status.

Please pay by credit card using the URL above. After payment, access "Inquiry (申込内容照会)" at E-payment Service (URL above), print out the Certificate of Payment (収納証明書), then cut and affix the indicated portion of the Certificate of Payment to column "8" on the Application Form. Submit together with other required documents to the University.

2 Payment at convenience stores (Lawson, Seven-Eleven, FamilyMart, Mini stop)

Please pay at a convenience store using the URL above. After payment, take the "Application Fee Statement" and cut out the "Certificate of Payment" part, affix it to column "8" on the Application Form. Submit it to the University together with other required documents. Please note that the payment fees should be paid by the applicant.

*If the "Certificate of Payment" or the proof of payment is not affixed in the designated space of the Application Form, the application documents will not be accepted.
